Iowa Globe Program



The GLOBE Program is a partnership between students, teachers, and scientists all around the world to learn about Earth's Systems, including water, sils, landcover, air, and seasons.

Each GLOBE Protocol (way to collect data) is connected to a satellite mission to Earth and students of all ages can participate. That means all our students can help scientists learn about our planet. But that's now all! Once a student is making GLOBE observations about their local area (where they are the experts) they will inherently observe phenomena that surprise them. "That's weird!" and "I didn't expect that." are commonly heard in GLOBE classes.

Because all of GLOBE Data is also available to students, this means students can use GLOBE data to answer their own questions too. "How does our data compare to others?" Through GLOBE students can be both service learners and scientists! Learn more at **globe.gov**.

STEM Challenge Cards

PLAY DOUGH ANIMAL CHALLENGE

Materials to Gather: Hair conditioner (1/2 cup), Corn Starch(1 cup), Sparkles or food coloring.

Directions:

Place cornstarch in a large bowl. Mix in the hair conditioner with your hands until it becomes smooth and pliable. Add a drop or two of the food coloring, or colored sparkles for variation. Add additional hair conditioner when needed to remain soft.

Animal Challenge: Shape your play dough into various animals. How many can you makie? Take a picture or video, and post to the NC STEM Region Facebook page!

*Note - This recipe is not edible! don't eat the play dough!
